

District President Jerry Saude's Address-Building on Viking History

He started with "Twas the day before Chistmas...."

Welcome sisters and brothers of our Sons of Norway Fraternal Lodges. Thank you for participating in this 60th District Convention here with us in Bismarck. My thanks to Sverdrup Lodge members and a special thanks to our host chair Ken Lien for taking on this task just 8 months ago. The theme chosen is "Building on Viking Foundations". Now that goes back awhile. If you are a student of history, the Vikings rose to fame in the 9th and 10th centuries. They haven't done so well in the 20th and 21st centuries have they? But those foundations are still standing. The Vikings were in fact Norwegians, Swedes, Danes and Finlanders and were actually world travelers. In fact they earned an infamous reputation for pillaging and raiding when in fact they were also merchant traders and settlers. It's a heritage that we can find reason to celebrate. Their influence lives on in the English language and customs in Europe and the British Isles. That brings me to storyline in the made for TV series, THE CROWN. The CROWN follows the life of a young girl named Elizabeth who became QUEEN OF ENGLAND. We all know her story. This series was intriguing for me as a student of history. My wife and I could binge watch Downton Abbey on Sunday nights and regret the lost sleep on Monday mornings. But the pagentry and priviledge of English gentry and 20th century lifestyles took us to another time. Highclere Castle is on my bucket list. I just want to have a whiskey with old Lady Grantham in that LIBRARY!

The intriguing storyline that I want to share with you has a tie to Sons of Norway, and I hope I can retell it so that you also pause to consider it.

Public Relations for the Royal Family was becoming a concern for the Queen, this was after the death of Princess Di and at the beginning of Prime Minister Tony Blair's rise in the Labor Party of England. Bill Clinton was president and George Bush was going to be elected soon. The Queen, against the advice of her family and her long-time confidant and personal secretary, commissioned focus groups across England to test the waters on public opinion of the Monarchy, the Royal family and the English patronage system.

The results were that most of her subjects felt the royals were; out of touch, badly advised and a smaller percentage thought, poor use of public funds.

The Queen met weekly with the PM and one day asked him pointedly, "What would you do to turn things around for us? Mr. Blair responded, {You mean if I were King?-What a thing to say to the Queen!

It then cuts out to Mr. Blair asking his staff to come up with 5 strategies for the royals. Well they came up with a list and a couple things were:

- Cut expenses- show their subjects that they could economize. They were viewed as spending too much on ancient rights and privileges.
- Consider the 300 year old Anti Settlement Act; this involved the Church of England and Catholics.
- Pomp and splendor Too many ceremonial offices in the realm
- Hereditory Grand Falconer- a position passed from father to son.
- Queens Herb Strewer and Washer of Sovereign Hands etc.
- Keeper of the Swans-

Blair said "we suggest a purge of honorifics, don't you just love that turn of a phrase...honorifics.

So the Queen called in all these honorfics and officers and asked them what they do and was amazed at the sense of pride these men and women had in their work and the traditions they represented. They did in fact do valuable work, under archaic and somewhat comical names. The Queen surmised that the monarchy is different. People want the magic, they want the mystery, and they want the royals to take them away from the simple and mundane lives they have.

The next meeting with the Prime Minister, Mr. Blair asked the queen if she had reviewed the suggestions of his team? She said she had and even discussed it with the family and she found; these were not empty ruralistic titles, but skills that had been passed down for generations. She posed the question, What is the common denominator for the sovereignty? She thought....

- Tradition is a strength
- It shows respect for our forbearers
- Its preservation of generations for their wisdom and learned experiences.
- She told Mr. Blair, Modernity is not always the answer, sometimes antiquity is too.
- The next scene cuts to a meeting with her private secretary and he's offering resignation in favor of his younger deputy. Someone more in tune with the times he says. He relays to the queen.....You can make alterations without tearing down the rest.

I'm asking you this question, What is the common denominator for our Sons of Norway?

And we can make alterations without tearing down the good parts. We are going to hear from Dan, Connie and Amy after our coffee break on what alterations have been made at Sons of Norway and how do we save the good parts and still modernize and create a successful Fraternal Insurance Organization and Fraternal Society that we can enjoy for years to come and hopefully pass on the generations that come after. Since 1895 when a need was identified and a need was met, with the birth of Sons of Norway by those 18 Norwegian forbearers and now we have preserved for generations since 1895.....Good job, well done and I'm so happy to stand here today and celebrate with you.

Financial Review January 1, 2022---December 31, 2023.

Our committee has examined the income and expenses reports and the bank statements provided by the District Treasurer. Our examination consisted of income and expense reports and bank statements from months chosen at random and not all months were examined. In our opinion, the selected parts of the financial records for the Sons of Norway District IV were presented accurately and fairly for the period beginning January 1, 2022 and ending December 31, 2023

The following recommendations are made for security and clarity purposes. Let it be resolved:

- 1. That the computer with the financial records need to be backed up and that the backup be stored at an offsite location.
- 2. That voided check numbers be listed in the check register as voided so all checks are listed consecutively.

- 5. That the District IV Convention profusely thank Marilyn Martinson for her ten years as the District IV Treasurer.
